Carbon Monoxide - The Silent Killer.

Hundreds of Canadians are hospitalized every year from carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning and more than 50 people die each year from carbon monoxide poisoning in Canada. 88% of all homes have something that poses a carbon monoxide threat.

CO is an invisible, odourless gas that is produced when fuels do not burn completely. Main sources of carbon monoxide in the home include wood or gas burning stoves, gas appliances, gasoline engines, kerosene heaters and barbecues being used inside.

Exposure to carbon monoxide can cause flu like symptoms such as headaches, nausea and dizziness, as well as confusion, drowsiness, loss of consciousness and death.

It is now law in Ontario that if your house has a fuel burning appliance or an attached garage you must install a carbon monoxide alarm outside each sleeping area in your home.

Test your CO alarm regularly to ensure it is working correctly. The owner’s manual should tell you how to test your alarm.

Remember to check the manual for information on when to buy a new carbon monoxide alarm.

Always react to a carbon monoxide alarm that has alarmed!

Get out of your home and contact your local fire department for assistance.

Remember a CO alarm is a good second line of defense. It is not a substitute for the proper care and maintenance of your fuel burning appliance(s).
