


The Municipality of Brockton is advancing project specific planning to address the deteriorated condition of Bridge No.02 (Greenock) on Bridge Street in Riversdale, just north of Highway 9, where shown on the Study Area map. The Municipality has identified advanced deterioration of the superstructure and substructure, including severe section loss in the floor beams and significant corrosion of the concrete and steel elements throughout. As a result, the bridge was recently closed to vehicular traffic. The project is being planned under Schedule 'B' of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA), as outlined in the Municipal Class EA Manual prepared by the Municipal Engineers Association (2015). Alternative solutions that were considered for the structure included the following:



1. Do Nothing;
2. Rehabilitate the Existing Bridge;
- 3A Replacement with a Single-Lane Bridge;
- 3B Replacement with a Two-Lane Bridge;
- 3C Replacement with a Recreational Bridge (i.e. Pedestrian);
4. Bridge Removal; and
5. Bridge Retention/Adaptation.

Based on the *Preferred Solution* selected and approved by Council on March 23, 2021, the Municipality intends to proceed with Alternative 3B, the replacement of the Riversdale Bridge (i.e. Greenock Bridge No.02) with a two-lane structure. Documentation of the development and review of the alternatives considered, including a summary of the planning and consultation process and a detailed evaluation and assessment of the alternatives, is provided in the updated Project File (Version 2; April 1, 2021) which is available on the Municipality's website.

This Notice initiates the minimum 30 calendar day comment period. Interested persons may provide written comment to our project team by May 3, 2021. All comments and concerns should be sent directly to Gregg Furtney at the Municipality of Brockton and/or Brent Willis at GM BluePlan Engineering.

In addition, a Part II Order request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e. requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g. require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request. The request should be sent in writing or by e-mail to:
