Committee Member Recruitment

The Municipality of Brockton is currently recruiting for Committee members on the Accessibility Advisory Committee and Elmwood Community Centre Board! The Accessibility Advisory Committee is responsible for making recommendations to Council that considers the needs and rights of persons with disabilities and assures maximum integrated accessibility for all citizens. The Accessibility Advisory Committee will fulfill the requirements of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 by providing vision and advice to the Council of the Municipality of Brockton to create an accessible and inclusive community. The Municipality seeks to gather the experience of individuals with a disability as members on the Accessibility Advisory Committee. The Elmwood Community Centre Board is a joint collaboration between the Municipality of Brockton and Municipality of West Grey to manage recreation programs and operations of the Elmwood Lions Hall, Elmwood Community Centre, ball diamond and adjoining park lands. The Elmwood Community Centre Board is a Recreation Advisory Committee of Brockton Council.

2023 Fees and Charges

On November 1, 2022, Council approved the 2023 fees and charges which came into effect January 1, 2023, or as otherwise stated. Visit **Brockton.ca/Fees** to view the 2023 Fees and Charges By-Law. **Note:** As of January 1, 2023 Bag Tags were increased to \$2.50/each and Recycling Bins were increased to \$20.00/each.

Animal Control – Dog Tags

As we enter 2023 residents are reminded to register their dogs for the year. Dog tags can be purchased at the Municipal Office (100 Scott St, Walkerton). The Municipality requires all dog owners to license their dogs within one week of the dog coming into their care.

The Municipality of Brockton is mailing dog tag invoices in January 2023. Invoices are based on dog owner information in our current database, and your dog will continue to wear the permanent tag you received previously. If you no longer own a dog, need a replacement tag, or need to register your dog, contact the Accounts Receivable Department by phone at 519-881-2223 Ext. 128, or email so we update our records.

Brockton Dollars gift certificates are redeemable at participating stores, restaurants, and other commercial establishments in denominations of \$10, \$25 and \$50. Brockton Dollars can be purchased as gifts for friends and family, or be offered as acknowledgements to employees, while also supporting local businesses. They can be purchased from the Municipal Office at 100 Scott Street from Monday to Friday, between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., or ordered in bulk through email. Businesses may redeem Brockton Dollars at the Municipal Office. If you're a Brockton retailer,

Winter Landfill Hours

From November 1 to March 31, the Brant Landfill is open on Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Greenock Landfill is open on Fridays from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. **As of February 4th, the Greenock Landfill will be open on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. removing the Friday hours.** The Walkerton/Hanover Landfill is open on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. All residents are encouraged to continue to use curbside pickup services. Winter Parking Restrictions

In accordance with Section 8 of the Municipality of Brockton's Consolidated Traffic and Parking By-Law 2020-052, no person shall park on any highway between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. inclusive during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April. A reminder that it is illegal to deposit snow on sidewalks or roads.

Winter Fire Hydrant Access Reminder

Help our firefighters by clearing snow around fire hydrants to allow easier access in an emergency. Remove any ice and snow, clear a three foot perimeter around the hydrant, and clear a path from the hydrant to the street. By-Law 2019-118 also requires individuals to keep hydrants clear from obstructions, such that shrubs, tees, and hedges should be trimmed to allow free access to the hydrants.

The Skating Oval will operate from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday to Sunday (7 days a week). The hours of operation may be adjusted depending

Grey Bruce Farmer's Week

It's no secret that agriculture is the leading business in Brockton - So it's fitting that the 57th annual Farmers Week industry conference was held at the Elmwood Community Centre in early January. Experts in beef, dairy, sheep, goat, horse and crop farming shared their knowledge with dozens of local farmers, in person and virtually.



Winter storms can happen almost anywhere. They can cause us problems. Know what to do before, during and after a storm. This will help keep you and your family safe from a winter fire.

- Test all smoke alarms. Do this at least once a month. This way you will know they are working. Install carbon monoxide alarms in your home. Test the alarms.
- Plan two ways out of the home in case of an emergency. Clear driveway and front walk of ice and snow. This will provide easy access to your home.
- Make sure your house number can be seen from the street. If you need help, firefighters will be able to find you.
- Be ready in case the power goes out. Have flashlights on hand. Also have battery-powered lighting and fresh batteries. Never use candles.
- Stay aware of winter weather. Listen to the television or radio for updates. Watch for bulletins online.
- Check on neighbors. Check on others who may need help.
- Generators should be used outdoors. Keep them away from windows and doors. Do not run a generator inside your garage, even if the door is open.
- Stay away from downed wires. Report any downed wires to authorities.
- Be ready if the heat stops working. Use extra layers of clothes and blankets to stay warm. If you use an emergency heat source, keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away.
- Turn portable heaters off when you leave the room. Turn them off when you go to bed.

Fact: Nearly half of all space heater fires involve electric space heaters.

Important Reminder: There are more home fires in winter than in any other season. Half of all home heating fires happen in December, January and February. As you stay cozy and warm this winter season, be fire smart!

The theme for this year's Crime Stoppers month is "Stand up, Stand Together". There are currently 38 Crime Stoppers programs operating in Ontario. Crime Stoppers is a not-for-profit community-based charitable civilian run program where the community, the media and the police work together to combat crime. Crime Stoppers offers residents a completely anonymous opportunity to play an active role in community safety.

You can contact Crime Stoppers toll free at 1-800-222-TIPS (8477) from anywhere in North America. Crime Stoppers does <u>not</u> have call display. Crime Stoppers tip lines are staffed by trained personnel that confidentially process the tips. You will <u>not</u> be asked to provide your name at any time. If you are eligible for a cash reward, the payment will be made using a confidential code. You <u>won't</u> be asked to provide your name

Statistics:

Since Crime Stoppers in Ontario formed in 1983:

- over 135,000 cases cleared
- more than 126,000 arrests
- \$8.3 million in rewards paid out
- over \$340 million worth of property recovered
- \$1.9 billion in drugs seized

Since Crime Stoppers of Grey Bruce started in 1987:

- over 2,730 cases cleared
- nearly 1,700 arrests
- more than \$286,000 in rewards approved
- \$4.6 million worth of property recovered
- \$50.1 million in drugs seized
