Chief Fire Official Issues Partial Open-Air Burn Ban

On August 11, 2025 the Chief Fire Official for the Municipality of Brockton issued a partial ban on open air fires (agricultural, brush, and derelict buildings) until further notice due to recent extreme temperatures and a lack of rainfall. Agricultural, brush, and derelict building burn permits are suspended until further notice.

Recreational fires (for cooking and warmth) are still permitted to continue, in compliance with Brockton's **Open Air Burn By-Law 2017-034.** Thank you for your cooperation in maintaining public safety.



High Water Consumption Notice

Due to increased water usage, the Municipality of Brockton is reminding residents of By-Law 2005-23, Being a By-Law to Restrict the Use of Municipal Water Supply By Limiting The Times Permitted to Water Gardens or Lawns.

Watering Schedule:

- Even-numbered civic addresses: Permitted to water on even-numbered calendar days between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and between 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- **Odd-numbered civic addresses:** Permitted to water on odd-numbered calendar days between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and between 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- Automatic watering systems: May operate any day, but only between 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

Residents are also asked to be mindful of their overall daily water consumption to help conserve water supply and reduce the strain on the municipal system.

Household Hazardous Waste will be collected in Brockton on September 20, 2025 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Bruce County Transportation Yard – 94 Bruce Road 2, Walkerton.

Tax Installment Due Dates – September 30, 2025 and November 28, 2025

Any payment received in our office after the due date will be considered late and any outstanding taxes will be subject to penalty and interest charges as per the Municipal Act. Allenford student awarded 2025 Walkerton Clean Water Legacy Award



This year's winner of the Walkerton Clean Water Legacy Award is Chloe Rands of Allenford, who is currently studying Environmental Technology at Centennial College in Toronto. Rands offered her heartfelt thanks to the awards committee at a recent presentation at the Heritage Water Garden in Walkerton, saying the \$1,500 award will help offset the cost of her education pathway. Rands' program balances theoretical knowledge and hands-on experience in biology, chemistry and civil engineering. Her goal after graduation is to join a government agency, non-profit or consulting firm focused on sustainable development. Down the road she would like to contribute to international water projects in developing nations.

The award is offered through an education endowment administered by the Community Foundation Grey Bruce. The Walkerton Clean Water Legacy Fund was created in 2020 to honour those affected by the E. coli outbreak in 2000 and to celebrate bright, enterprising students in Grey and Bruce counties entering the field of environmental studies or clean water management. Bruce County Reminds Residents: "When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors!"

With summer in full swing and Bruce County buzzing with outdoor fun, we encourage everyone to stay alert to changing weather conditions. Thunderstorm season is here. Don't let a summer storm catch you off guard.

Lightning strikes remain a leading cause of weather-related deaths in Canada, with outdoor recreation enthusiasts and workers at highest risk. Most strikes occur in open areas or under trees.

Key Safety Tips:

- The safest place to be during a thunderstorm is inside.
- Get inside immediately when you hear thunder. Lightning is within striking distance.
- Stay away from windows and seek interior rooms or basements during storms.
- Don't run water. Lightning can travel through plumbing.
- Avoid small shelters like picnic pavilions. You need to be in a fully enclosed space, like a building or a vehicle.
- If caught outside, crouch low with feet together in a low-lying area (don't lie down).

"We want everyone to enjoy Bruce County's outdoor experiences safely," says Ray Lux, Bruce County's emergency management coordinator. "Stay informed by monitoring weather alerts and take shelter when storms are in the forecast."

Most thunderstorms last under an hour, but proper precautions during that time can save lives.
