# 2026 Budget Feedback

Share your input on the 2026 Budget! The Municipality is seeking feedback from both service groups/organizations and residents to help prepare the 2026 Budget.



Service groups/organizations that would like to make a budget request from the Municipality of Brockton can submit a budget request by completing a Budget Request Form by September 10, 2025.

Residents are invited to complete our Community Budget Engagement Survey, sharing your priorities for the 2026 Budget. The survey takes about 10 minutes to complete. Information collected from the budget survey will help to pinpoint how well Municipal services are understood and valued, and which services are important for residents. The budget survey will close on September 10, 2025.

# Bruce County Household Hazardous Waste Collection – September 20, 2025

Household Hazardous Waste will be collected in Brockton on September 20, 2025 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Bruce County Transportation Yard – 94 Bruce Road 2, Walkerton.

Any payment received in our office after the due date will be considered late and any outstanding taxes will be subject to penalty and interest charges as per the Municipal Act. # **Leaf Collection**

Leaf Collection for Walkerton, Lake Rosalind, and Marl Lakes is scheduled for October 20, October 27, and November 10, 2025. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable paper waste bags (plastic bags not accepted) and placed at the curbside by 7:00 a.m. for collection. A friendly reminder that no garden clippings, compost, or small branches will be picked up.



# Reminder: Road Closures are Posted on Municipal511 Website

Municipal 511 is a valuable resource for motorists to stay informed about road construction projects that may impact their commute, or road closures due to construction or events. Municipal 511 is a map-based road information service designed to enhance communication between the Municipality and the public. Most local municipalities are posting road closures to Municipal 511 – displaying a comprehensive map of all impacts to roads by our local



governments. Events on Ontario 511 for Provincial highways and projects are also shared to the Municipal 511 website.

#### Municipal 511 is used to share:

Emergency Road Closures and Repairs: Get updates on road closures, detours, and repair schedules happening within the Municipality.

Public Events: Receive information about local events and activities that may impact travel routes in the Municipality.

Road Restrictions: Keep up with transportation updates that may affect commercial and personal travel.

Safety Issues: Receive crucial information about conditions or risks that may compromise the safety of individuals, vehicles, or property during events that necessitate road closures or traffic modifications

Planned Capital Projects: Stay informed about upcoming developments and infrastructure improvements.


