Special Council Meeting to Appoint New Councillor




Council will hold a Special Council Meeting on Thursday, January 22, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. at the Bruce County Council Chambers to appoint an individual to fill the vacant Councillor seat.

Recycling Changes Started January 1, 2026

Residents of Brockton have moved to the Producer Responsibility Model, important information for residents to know:

-  Recycling collection days are remaining the same!
-  All Recycling Bins at the Walkerton Recycling Depot, Brant Landfill and Greenock Transfer Station are closed to collection.
-  Accepted items have expanded and now include flattened Cardboard!

Reminder that businesses of Brockton will be responsible for their own collection beginning January 1, 2026 under the new program. Recycling is undergoing a legislated shift to a full producer responsibility model under the Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act, 2016 and Ontario Regulation 391/21. This transition is being managed by Circular Materials Ontario, a Producer Responsibility Organization. Ineligible sources are defined as any entities not an Eligible Source and under the legislation and regulation, any ineligible source must make private arrangements for recycling collection.

Animal Control – Dog Tags

The Municipality of Brockton is mailing dog tag invoices in January 2026. Invoices are based on dog owner information in our current database, and your dog will continue to wear the permanent tag you received previously. 2026 Dog Tag Fees

- First Dog - \$21.00
- Additional Dog(s) - \$21.00
- Late Fee (after April 1st) - \$10.50/per tag
- Dangerous Dog(s) - \$210.50/per dog
- Replacement Dog Tag - \$5.50
- Kennel Licence - New or Renewal (Includes first inspection fee) *More than 3 dogs and must meet Kennel Licence requirements - \$157.50
- Kennel Licence - Non-Compliance re-inspection of Kennel - \$52.50/per inspection
- Kennel Licence Late Payment Charge (after April 1st) - \$63.00
- Reclaim Fee - \$107.00 Municipal Fee (not including Pound fees incurred)

Kennels: If you are registering a new kennel or renewing a kennel license, a Kennel Application and inspection is required. Please contact the Building/By-Law Department at 519-881-2223 Ext. 141 or [email the Animal Control/By-Law Enforcement Officer](#) to obtain a Kennel License Application.

Winter Parking Restrictions

In accordance with Section 8 of the Municipality of Brockton's Consolidated Traffic and Parking By-Law 2020-052, no person shall park on any highway between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. inclusive during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April.

Carbon Monoxide Alarm Reminder

The new Fire Code requirements came into effect on January 1, 2026, expanding Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarm installation in:

- **Existing Homes:** Alarms will now be required on **every storey**, not just near sleeping areas:
- **Multi-Unit Residential Buildings:** CO alarms must be installed in **all suites** meeting certain conditions, **service rooms**, and, in some cases, public corridors.

The steps to adding your event are simple:


-  Visit events.brockton.ca and click on [Submit an Event](#).

Bruce County Media Release – Winter Doesn't Wait for You to Be Ready

Bruce County has already experienced significant snow and winter weather this season. And if history has taught us anything, it's that the next storm isn't a matter of *if*—it's *when*.

Heavy snow and ice storms don't just create pretty winter scenes; they can snap power lines and leave you in the dark.

Is your emergency kit stocked with what you and your family may need?

It's important to refresh your emergency kit for winter with items able to keep you safe, warm and calm while the storm passes for a minimum of 72 hours, keeping in mind it could be even longer in some situations.

"Extra consideration should be taken for your home emergency kit during the winter months," says Ray Lux, Bruce County's emergency management coordinator. "Power outages can have more implications with cold weather. Make sure your kit has the supplies to help keep you safe and warm in the event of a power failure during a winter storm."

Your winter emergency kit should include:

- **Cold-weather gear for indoor use** – Warm blankets, thermal blankets, wool socks, extra mitts and hats.
- **Flashlights with fresh batteries** – Rather than using your phone as a flashlight, reserve its power and use a flashlight. Darkness comes early in winter.
- **Non-perishable food and water** – Essential year-round, but critical when you can't cook or access clean water.
- **A backup generator** – Ideal for maintaining lights and heat during outages in Bruce County.
- **A designated warm room** – If a generator isn't possible, choose one room you can seal off to trap heat. Keep those doors closed.
