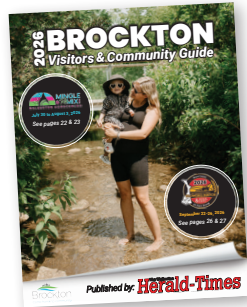

Wetlands, wildlife, and wonder in the Greenock Swamp

Guided stories of the Greenock Swamp's past bring this landscape to life. Visitors learn about the loggers and moonshiners who once made the swamp their home, along with the legacy of lumber baron Henry Cargill, founder of the community that bears his name. His influence can still be seen in the churches, businesses, schools, and homes that helped shape the area.

For those wishing to linger, the Chepstow Inn — the oldest continuously operating hotel in Bruce County — offers a cozy bed and breakfast experience steeped in history. Nearby Cargill invites exploration through its vibrant murals, well-preserved heritage buildings, and local attractions such as the Bruce County Book Store, a welcoming café, the Mill Pond Art Gallery, a library, a convenience store, and a community centre.

One of the most accessible ways to experience the swamp is at Schmidt Lake, where a designated parking area marks the trail entrance. From there, visitors can enjoy a short, easy walk through the forest leading to a scenic lookout over the lake. The trail is well travelled and popular with walkers of all ages, making it an ideal stop for those looking to experience the beauty of the Greenock Swamp without a strenuous hike.

Nature lovers will find plenty to admire as well. The swamp is home to unique flora and fauna, including carnivorous pitcher plants, towering ancient trees, and a wide variety of wildlife that thrives in this protected environment. Ongoing efforts are underway to have the Greenock Swamp recognized as a "Wetland of Distinction" by the Society of Wetland Scientists, further highlighting its environmental significance.

Cargill's calendar is full of opportunities to experience the swamp and surrounding community firsthand. Greenock Swamp Tours, hosted by the Cargill and Greenock Swamp Promotional Association, take place on May 30, June 20, August 22, September 19, and October 3. The community also hosts the Pickin' by the Pond Country Music Festival from July 2–5, and the Holmdale Pro Rodeo from July 31 to August 2.

Step into a landscape shaped by ice, time, and legend. The Greenock Swamp is unlike anywhere else in southern Ontario — a place where carnivorous plants thrive, deep kettle lakes shimmer beneath the trees, and stories of glowing green lights linger in the air. As the wind moves through ancient cedar stands, echoes of loggers, bootleggers, and long-forgotten trails seem to follow close behind.

Formed at the end of the last glaciation, the Greenock Swamp is the largest forested wetland in southern Ontario. What began as a massive, water-filled basin slowly transformed as organic sediments accumulated, leaving behind a rare mosaic of small lakes, rivers, and wetlands. Today, it stands as both an ecological treasure and a fascinating destination for history lovers.



Opportunity takes shape at East Ridge Business Park



Explore

Located in the northeastern area of Walkerton, East Ridge Business Park began as a fully serviced business park and is quickly transforming into one of Brockton's most dynamic growth areas. What was once primarily commercial and industrial space is now emerging as a vibrant, mixed-use hub supporting residential, retail, recreational, and employment opportunities.

Today, East Ridge is among the fastest-growing areas in Bruce County, home to a diverse mix of professional offices, restaurants, industrial suppliers, small manufacturers, and service-based businesses. Momentum continues in 2026, with several new developments underway, including an attainable housing subdivision, a six-bed hospice, a fast-food restaurant and convenience store, and a light manufacturing facility.

Strategically located at the intersection of County Road 4 and County Road 19, East Ridge offers excellent access to regional transportation networks and is within two hours of major international routes, including Highway 401, making it an attractive location for both businesses and residents.

The park is also home to the Bruce Power Regional Soccer Park, which features a modern building with washrooms and equipment storage, along with trail connections to Brockton's extensive trail system. Two electric vehicle charging stations are located on site, and additional land has been designated for a future municipal recreation facility.

The Saugeen River: Brockton's timeless waterway

Flowing gracefully through the heart of Brockton, the Saugeen River is more than just a beautiful backdrop — it's a place where adventure, history, and relaxation meet.

Stretching approximately 160 kilometres from its headwaters in the Osprey Wetland to its mouth at Lake Huron in Southampton, the Saugeen winds its way through Walkerton before continuing north and west toward Paisley, where it joins the Teeswater River. For centuries, the river has shaped the region — first as a vital transportation route for Indigenous peoples, then for early European settlers, and later as the driving force behind mills that powered local industry and community growth.

Today, the Saugeen remains one of Bruce County's most treasured natural assets. Whether you're paddling downstream in a canoe or kayak, casting a line from shore, floating on a tube with friends, or strolling along a scenic riverside trail, the river offers a peaceful escape in every season.



Outdoor Adventures

PADDLE, FLOAT AND EXPLORE

A canoe or kayak trip down the Saugeen is a cherished tradition for many families and visitors. Much of the river is easily navigable by small craft (outside of spring flooding), making it ideal for beginners and experienced paddlers alike. Expect calm stretches, gentle bends, and plenty of opportunities to spot wildlife along the way, from herons and turtles to deer along the riverbanks.

CAST A LINE

Anglers from across Ontario are drawn to the Saugeen's world-class fishing opportunities. With numerous well-marked access points, it's easy to find your perfect fishing spot.

Before heading out, be sure to check regulations with the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry regarding licences, seasons, size limits, and catch-and-release guidelines.

Convenient fish cleaning stations are available at Lobies Park and at the Durham Street Bridge (behind Tim Hortons), where used fishing line can also be safely recycled.

STAY AND PLAY AT LOBIES PARK

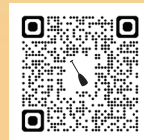
Just minutes from downtown Walkerton, Lobies Park is a favourite riverside destination for both locals and visitors. The campground is a popular home base for summer adventures, offering easy river access, four-season trails, fishing docks, and beautiful picnic areas. It's the perfect place to spend an afternoon — or a long weekend — reconnecting with nature while still being close to shops and restaurants.

PICTURE-PERFECT MOMENTS

Don't forget your camera. From mist rising off the water at sunrise to kids laughing as they float downstream on a sunny afternoon, the Saugeen is full of photo-worthy memories waiting to be captured.

Whether you're seeking outdoor adventure, peaceful reflection, or family fun, the Saugeen River delivers an unforgettable experience in every season.

MAKE A SPLASH THIS SUMMER

Cool off at the Walkerton Centennial Pool and Kinsmen Splash Pad, located at 1 James Street. The pool is open from June through August and offers swimming lessons, aquatic courses, public swims, and pool rentals. The splash pad is open daily from 9 a.m. to dusk during the summer months, making it the perfect stop for families.

Water enthusiasts can explore the beautiful Saugeen River by canoeing, kayaking or tubing. Multiple launch points are available throughout Brockton, offering peaceful paddling and scenic views. Paddling brochures with river access details are available at the Municipal Office (100 Scott Street, Walkerton) and at the Lobies Park kiosk (20 Hannah Street) near the canoe and kayak launch.

If camping is your style, book a stay at **Lobies Park Campground** or **Saugeen Riverbank Campground** (1343 Bruce Road 4). Both campgrounds offer overnight sites, playgrounds, and convenient access to the Saugeen River and trail system.



PARKS, TRAILS AND OUTDOOR PLAY

The Saugeen River Trail system can be enjoyed year-round – walk, hike, or bike in the warmer months, and ski or snowshoe when snow blankets the landscape. The trails provide stunning views and connect visitors to the natural beauty of Bruce County.

Brockton is also home to beautiful parks in Walkerton, Cargill, Chepstow, and Elmwood, offering picnic shelters, pavilions, playgrounds, and green space for gatherings and events.

Sports enthusiasts will find:

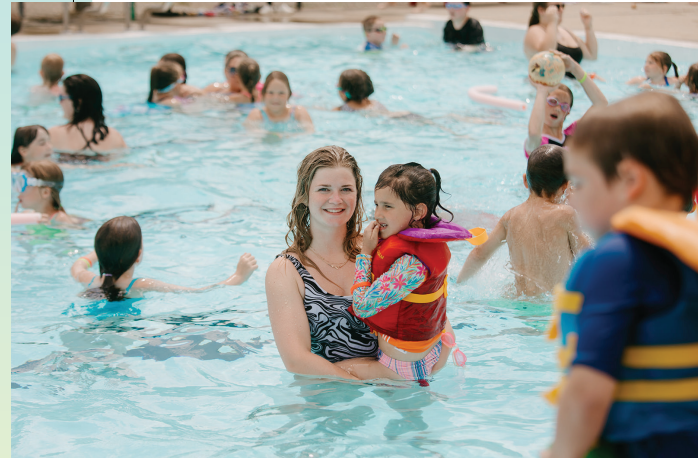
- Ball diamonds in Walkerton, Cargill, Chepstow, and Elmwood

Pickleball continues year-round! During the colder months, indoor pickleball is available at the Cargill Community Centre, providing a great way to stay active all winter long.



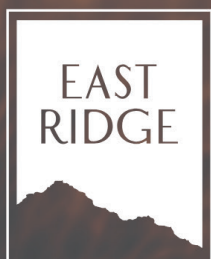

Golf lovers have excellent options in Brockton. The *Walkerton Golf & Curling Club* (164 Bruce Road 2) features a scenic 9-hole, par 36 course spanning 3,100 yards and welcomes golfers of all skill levels. *Whispering Hills Golf Club* (1144 Bruce Road 4 West) offers an 18-hole, par 72 championship course measuring 6,210 yards from the blue tees and 5,095 yards from the old tees. For indoor practice or rainy-day fun, visit *The Birdie Barn* (12 Wallace Street, Walkerton), featuring golf simulators and lawn games.

When winter arrives, the *Walkerton Golf & Curling Club* transitions into curling season, offering another great way to stay active.



WINTER IN BROCKTON

Winter brings skating, figure skating, hockey, and ice rentals at the *Walkerton Community Centre* (209 Durham Street West). Weather permitting, enjoy the outdoor skating loop on the ball diamonds behind the facility.

The groomed Saugeen River Trail is a favourite for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing – thank you to the *Walkerton Firefighters' Association* for maintaining the trail throughout the winter months.



Looking for some machine-powered adventure? The former CN Rail Trail runs through Brockton, connecting Mildmay in the south to Paisley in the north. This scenic corridor is

maintained by Bruce County and is open to ATVs, side-by-sides, and snowmobiles with proper permits and insurance.

Whether you're exploring in the warmer months or riding fresh powder in winter, the trail offers a convenient and enjoyable way to experience the countryside. Riders are reminded to stay on marked trails and show respect for the private landowners who generously allow access across their properties. Responsible riding helps ensure this trail remains open and enjoyable for everyone.

Why they're called the Dirt Pigs and why everyone loves Pigstock

Local legend has it that a ballplayer's playful antics once learned the team the nickname "the Dirt Pigs." The dirt eventually washed away, but the name stuck, and so did a legacy.

Today, the Dirt Pigs are best known for hosting one of Ontario's premier baseball tournaments, right here in Brockton, welcoming more than a hundred teams from across the province each summer. Pigstock 2026 runs August 13–16, promising four days of top-tier baseball and unforgettable community fun.

The tournament takes over every ball diamond in Brockton, but Pigstock is about far more than what happens on the field.

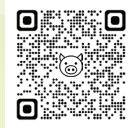
The weekend also features a full lineup of activities, including dances, raffles, breakfasts, food booths, beer gardens, a kids' program, and plenty of entertainment for all ages.

At the heart of Pigstock is giving back. Through the Dirt Pigs Foundation, the organization supports a wide range of charities, organizations, and individuals throughout the community. Past recipients include the Walkerton Fire Department, South Bruce Grey Health Centre (Walkerton), Bruce Grey

Child and Family Services, bursaries at Sacred Heart High School and Walkerton District Community School, local service clubs, and numerous sports teams. The Rob Bester Memorial Fund also continues to assist community members in need.

With more than \$325,000 donated to date, the Dirt Pigs' impact extends well beyond baseball. The tournament draws thousands of visitors to Brockton, filling hotels and campsites months in advance, keeping restaurants busy, and generating meaningful economic benefits for local businesses.
