### Public Comments on Possible Commemoration

This spring will mark the 25th anniversary of the Walkerton e.coli outbreak, which occurred in May 2000. As we approach this date, we recognize the anniversary will bring mixed emotions for many residents. For some, this anniversary may offer a chance to reflect and remember, while others may prefer to look ahead, leaving the past behind. Residents who were impacted might find comfort in coming together with the community to honour memories and share their experiences.

In light of this, Brockton Council is seeking input from residents about a possible commemoration to take place in May 2025 at the Heritage Water Garden in Walkerton. The commemoration could provide an opportunity for the community to reflect on the past, acknowledge the progress made, and recognize ongoing efforts to ensure that Ontarians have access to safe, clean drinking water.

We invite residents to share any thoughts, ideas or concerns regarding a possible commemoration by Friday, March 7, 2025. Your feedback is invaluable in helping us determine the most meaningful and appropriate way to recognize this anniversary. We welcome all feedback, including if our community feels a commemoration is not appropriate.

## **Livestock Evaluator Expression of Interest**

The Municipality of Brockton is seeking individuals to serve as a Livestock Evaluator for the Municipality of Brockton, responsible under the **Ontario Wildlife Damage Compensation Program** to conduct a thorough investigation within 72 hours of being notified or livestock, poultry, and/or honey bees that have been damaged or killed by wildlife. The Evaluator/investigator must ensure all relevant evidence is documented through detailed colour photos and a complete application form. Livestock Evaluators are required on an infrequent basis throughout the year, and the Evaluator will receive compensation for their services. Individuals will be appointed as a Livestock Evaluator for approximately two years (2025 to 2026). ## **Business Grants Available**

The Municipality of Brockton is excited to announce its 2025 **Community Improvement Plan** grant program is now accepting applications. Bruce County's **Spruce the Bruce program** also launched, resulting in several different opportunities for eligible business and property owners to enhance their spaces.



In Brockton, there are six financial assistance programs available: building facades, signage improvements, accessibility improvements, energy efficiencies, conversion or expansion of vacant or underutilized spaces, and farm gates.

Spruce the Bruce has 10 grants applications available: facade improvements, fascia signage, perpendicular signage, awnings, patio installations, community marketing, agri-food innovation, business accessibility, produce and experience development, and residential improvement.

Both the municipal and county programs supports a maximum of 50 per cent of eligible costs, excluding taxes, up to a set maximum per grant. Funding for each is available on a first-come, first-serve basis to eligible businesses and property owners, and both can be applied to for the same project in the same calendar year.

# Are You Prepared for Communications in an Emergency?

**Bruce County, Ontario:** When we think of emergencies, we often picture tornadoes, floods, or power outages. But what if the crisis impacted something we rely on daily—our ability to communicate? In an increasingly connected world, a failure of phone networks or internet services can leave families struggling to reach one another. That's why including a communications plan in your emergency preparedness strategy is crucial.

Cell phone networks and internet services can go down due to severe weather, cyberattacks, or infrastructure failures. Having a plan in place can ensure you and your loved ones stay connected when it matters most.

### How to Prepare for a Communications Failure:

- **Keep a landline phone at home.** Ensure it will still work during a power outage and consider having a battery backup.
- Use a generator wisely. If you have one, test it before an emergency to understand how many devices it can support. Unplug non-essential appliances to extend its capacity.
- Have a hard copy of key contacts. Store written phone numbers for family, emergency services, and medical providers in case your phone battery dies, or digital records are inaccessible.
- Set a family meeting location. If phone contact isn't possible, agree in advance on a place to reunite.
- Know your child's school emergency plan. Schools have procedures in place for communication failures—ensure your family's plan aligns with theirs.
- Back up essential documents. Print copies of medical records, insurance information, and emergency plans. Store them in a waterproof container and keep digital backups on an external drive or in the cloud.
- **Prepare for recovery.** Regularly back up important computer files so you can quickly regain access to critical information after an outage.

"We rely so heavily on our phones and computers that a communications failure can cause significant stress," says Ray Lux, Bruce County Emergency Management Coordinator. "Having a backup plan will help keep your loved ones safe and ensure you can stay connected when it matters most. Talk to your family now, so you're prepared before an emergency happens."
