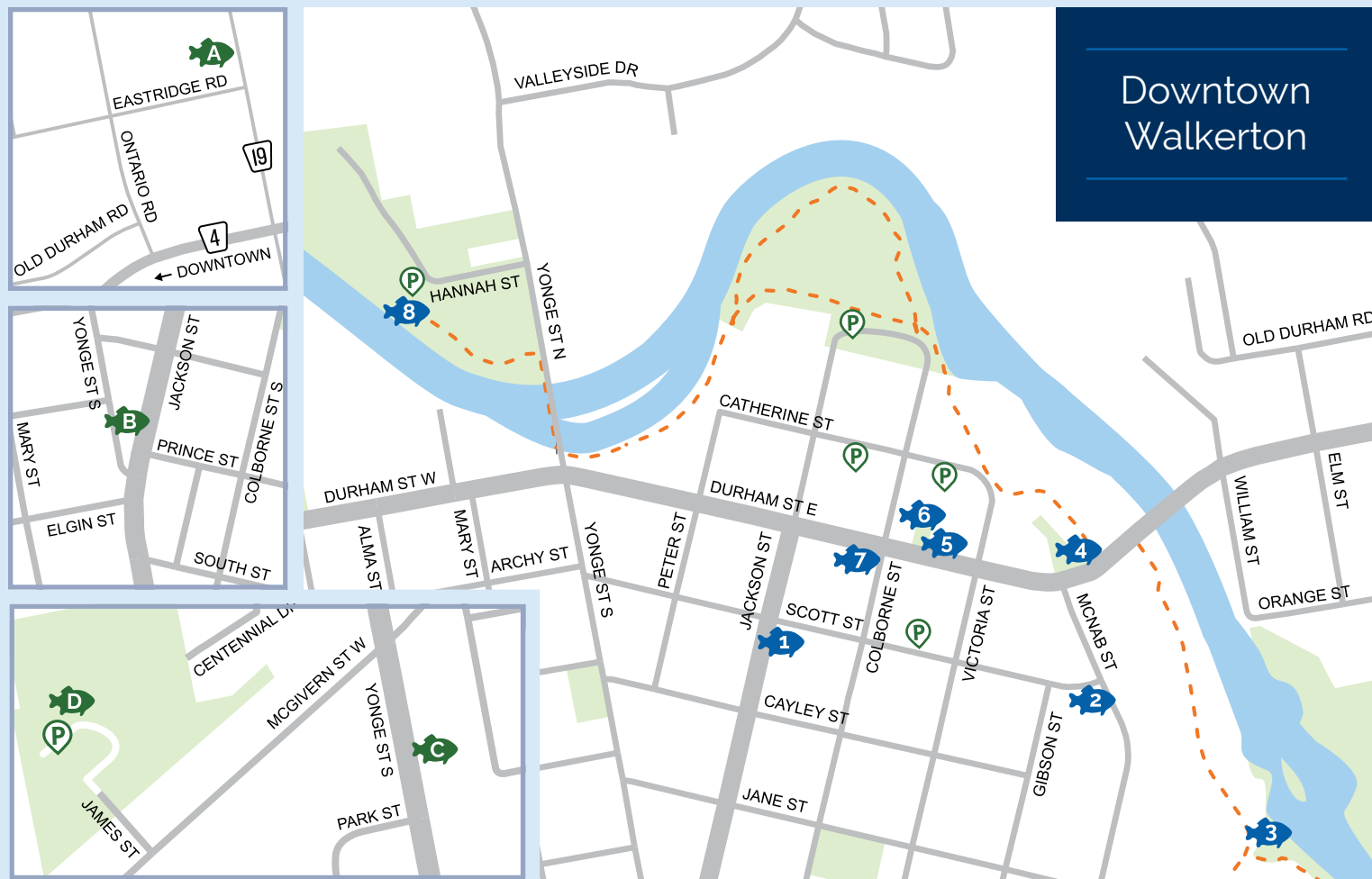
**The Fish Art Story**

Nestled along the scenic Saugeen River—renowned for some of the best smallmouth bass fishing in North America—Walkerton has fully embraced its fishing roots. What started as an idea to enhance tourism and the visitor experience, and “reel in” more people to the area, has grown into a vibrant, community-wide art experience. Today, 12 metal fish sculptures can be found throughout town; the shape designed by artist Debbie Schenk, crafted by Freiburger Welding, base-coated by CSN Walkerton Collision, and transformed into colourful works of art by local artists and graphic designers.
