Greenock Transfer Station Change in Hours of Operation

The Greenock Landfill was re-designated as a Transfer Station by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks. The Greenock Transfer Station (564 Concession 10, Chepstow) is now open on **Fridays from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.** Residents are encouraged to use curbside collection. Residents of Greenock can also attend the Brant Landfill (57 Concession 8, Elmwood) on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. or Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

Bruce County are collecting household hazardous waste on September 24, 2022 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Bruce County Transportation Yard, 94 Bruce Road 2, Walkerton. Waste must be received in containers that can be disposed of, containers are not emptied and returned (ie. gas cans). Empty metal paint cans are blue box recyclable.

How You Can Help?

- Help **Keep our facilities clean.** Put garbage and pet waste into receptacles.
- Remember to **respect property**, materials and equipment when using services or participating in programs at our municipal community centres, ice pads, parks and pavilions
- Report items such as graffiti, broken glass or burnt out lights in any municipal facility or park
- **Report vandalism**, such as a park bench that has been damaged or playground equipment that has been tampered with

Report activities such as verbal assaults, threats/aggression, physical harm, alcohol or drug consumption, theft and harassment

Fire Department: Back to School Fire Safety

Back-to-school is right around the corner and for many students that means moving away from home and into a new apartment, house or dorm. Whether leaving home for the first time or returning to school, these fire safety and prevention tips could save your life.

- Pay attention while cooking Cooking is the #1 cause of home fires in Ontario. More than 1,190 cooking-related fires happen annually (Ontario 2015-2019). When preparing food, never leave anything you're cooking unattended. If you're sleepy or have consumed alcohol, don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Be extra careful with candles Candles are a major cause of fires. For a safer option, use battery operated candles. They look and smell just as nice without the risk. If you burn candles, keep them away from anything flammable. Never leave a lit candle unattended and put it out before you leave a room or go to bed.
- Know the tools that keep you safe Make sure you have a working smoke alarm and carbon monoxide alarm. Only 45 per cent of residential fires from 2010-2019 had functioning smoke alarms. If you live in a dorm, make sure you know the location of the closest fire alarm pull station and the nearest emergency exit from your floor.
- Have a plan 40 years ago, you had 17 minutes to escape a fire. Today, you have less than three.
 (CloseYourDoor.org). Fire spreads faster than ever before because of synthetic materials, furniture and construction. Make sure to plan and practice your fire escape plan. Know what to do and where to go during an emergency.

Fire Safety is for everyone! These tips can help all residents – not just those heading to school, so please share with your students, family and friends.

South Bruce O.P.P. Detachment - Back to School Safety

Children across the South Bruce Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) detachment area have returned to school. Some will be walking, some will be riding bikes and many others will be riding on school buses to get to and from school. The return of school buses and student pedestrians means the roads will be busier. Give yourself extra time to get where you're going and help keep out students safe. The South Bruce OPP is asking all drivers to be extra careful and observant for children on or near roadways, particularly near school zones. Keep your speed down and watch for students that try to cross the road in an unexpected location.

Crossing Guards:

Did you know that it's against the law to ignore a school crossing guard? According to Section 176 of the Highway Traffic Act (HTA), your vehicle must be stopped until the crosswalk is clear.

Where a school crossing guard displays a school crossing stop sign as provided in subsection (2), the driver of any vehicle or street car approaching the school crossing guard shall stop before reaching the crossing and shall remain stopped until all persons, including the school crossing guard, have cleared the roadway and it is safe to

Motorists that fail to stop for a school crossing guard stop sign face a fine of \$365 and 4 demerit points upon conviction.

School buses:

The South Bruce OPP is reminding drivers to watch for school buses stopped on the roadway with alternating red lights flashing. Under Section 175 of the Highway Traffic Act (HTA), drivers meeting a stopped school bus and drivers approaching a stopped school bus must stop:

- Every driver or street car operator, when meeting on a highway, other than a highway with a median strip, a stopped school bus that has its overhead red signal-lights flashing, shall stop before reaching the bus and not proceed until the bus moves or the overhead lights have stopped flashing.
- When approaching a school bus from the rear that has its overhead signal-lights flashing shall stop at least 20 meters before reaching the bus and not proceed until the bus moves or the overhead lights have stopped flashing.

Motorists that fail to stop for a stopped school bus face stiff penalties upon conviction. First offence, the maximum fine is \$2,000 and 6 demerit points. For each subsequent offence, the maximum fine is \$4,000, or imprisonment, or both, and 6 demerit points.

If the driver can't be identified, the registered owner of the vehicle observed in violation of the law may be charged with failing to stop for a stopped school bus.

The South Bruce OPP encourages all parents and caregivers to take some time this weekend to talk to their children on the importance of being safe when travelling to and from school.
