## **Pinkerton Update**

The Municipality of Brockton and County of Bruce continue to work closely with Provincial agencies, and Saugeen Valley Conservation Authority in response to the unique flooding situation in Pinkerton.

Water level monitoring remains ongoing by Saugeen Valley, Bruce County, and Municipal staff.

As the dam is privately owned, temporary restoration and repairs of the breach remain the property owner's responsibility, under the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources Jurisdiction. The Municipality has no jurisdiction in relation to the repairs associated with this dam breach.

Bruce County Road 15 is currently closed until repairs can be made in accordance with the advice of the engineering consultant. Residents requiring access to their property for work related to flood impacts prior to the road opening are asked to contact [bhayes@brucecounty.on.ca](mailto:bhayes@brucecounty.on.ca) or 519-881-2400 to coordinate arrangements.

A partial removal of the coffer dam will occur the week of May 4th, 2026 to ensure all residential properties in this area have access to the County Road. The coffer dam sandbags can be re-installed should water concerns arise again in the future. The main portions of the coffer dam will remain in place until the temporary repair of the dam breach has been completed by the private property owner.
